CONCEPT NOTE

Launch of the Africa Agriculture Trade Monitor (AATM) 2024 Exploring the Climate Change and Trade Nexus

AKADEMIYA2063 and the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI), in partnership with the Alliance for a Green Revolution in Africa (AGRA), are convening a hybrid event to debate and promote the findings of the Africa Agriculture Trade Monitor (AATM) 2024. As in prior editions, the seventh AATM provides improved trade statistics, uses consistent indicators to monitor trends, and provides deeper insights into Africa's participation in global trade and the status of intra-African trade.

The AATM contributes to our understanding of African agricultural trade and its relationship with food and nutrition security in several important ways. This edition focuses on the impact of climate change on African agrifood trade patterns. It examines topics such as the carbon footprint of agrifood trade, intra-African trade in virtual water, and the fruit and vegetable value chains. The year's report also includes a look at regional trade integration and trade costs in the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS).

The AATM is produced and published under the African Growth and Development Policy (AGRODEP) Modeling Consortium and the Regional Strategic Analysis and Knowledge Support System (ReSAKSS) programs. The report is a collaborative effort by AKADEMIYA2063 and IFPRI. It builds on the work of both organizations in support of the Comprehensive Africa Agriculture Development Programme (CAADP) and Africa's broader development agenda.

The annual flagship report is the only publication dedicated entirely to African agricultural trade and policies. It provides a thorough analysis of Africa's agricultural trade in regional and global markets and selected value chains using high-quality statistics relevant to the sector.

Designed to strengthen evidence-based policymaking in agricultural trade, the previous six editions of the **AATM published since 2018 have covered:**

- » The impact of COVID-19 on African agricultural trade
- » The role of informal cross-border flows in Africa's trade
- » The potential impact of global trade tensions
- » Major developments affecting Africa's trade performance
- » The potentially transformative impact of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA)
- » The impact of the Russia-Ukraine War on African agriculture, trade, and food systems



Objectives

This formal launch of the AATM will convene a diverse set of experts from the research and development community, the public and private sectors, and representatives from international and regional organizations, and other stakeholder groups for a discussion on the nexus of climate change and agrifood trade in Africa.

Topics to be addressed include:

- 1. The already known and likely future impact of climate change on agrifood trade in Africa.
- 2. The potential of intra-African agricultural trade to address issues of water scarcity and promote more sustainable use of water resources.
- 3. The latest trends, progress, and outlook on African agricultural trade in regional and global markets.
- 4. Trends, opportunities, and challenges in fruit and vegetable value chains.
- 5. Patterns of trade integration in the ECOWAS region.
