Forecasts Brief Series Niger - Groundnut


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he crop production forecast brief series by AKADEMIYA2063's Africa Agriculture Watch (AAgWa) aims to provide more accurate and timely data on harvest and yields for nine major crops across nearly 50 African countries. The timeliness, wide availability, and easy access to this type of data will allow stakeholders across the value chain to better plan and execute policy and business actions more efficiently. The data published in the briefs are generated through the Africa Crop Production (AfCP) model, an Artificial Intelligence (AI-based) model applied to


remotely sensed geo-biophysical data to produce estimates at pixel as well as administrative levels as early as the beginning of every growing season. In Brief 69, we provide forecasts on groundnut production in Niger.

In 2023, groundnut production in Niger is projected to reach 516,896 metric tons (MT), which corresponds to a 6% increase over 2022 production levels. However, the highest groundnut production levels are expected in the Southeastern and Southern departments, particularly in Dakoro (Maradi), Maïné-Soroa (Diffa), Mayahi (Maradi), Mirriah (Zinder), Tessaoua (Maradi), and Groumdji (Maradi) with production volumes estimated at 72,358 MT, 51,848 MT, 46,097 MT, 39,382 MT, 36,603 MT, and 32,508 MT, respectively.

In comparison, lower production values are observed in Illéla (Tahoua), Niamey, Bkonni (Tahoua), Bouza (Tahoua), Madaoua (Tahoua), and Tillabéry, with production levels reaching only 33 MT, 112 MT, 138 MT, 246 MT, 582 MT, and 921 MT, respectively.

Moreover, the most significant groundnut production increases in 2023 are expected to occur in Dakoro, Maïné-Soroa, Mayahi, Mirriah, and Tessaoua, with differences of, 3,614 MT, 2,850 MT, 2,429 MT, 2,126 MT, and 1,912 MT, respectively. These correspond to changes of, respectively, 5%, 6%, 6%, 6%, and 6%.
